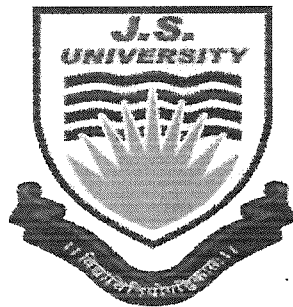

Pre-Disaster: Prevention, preparation, Actual disaster: Short term plan, stress and trauma, relief, recovery, restoration.


Post-Disaster: Rehabilitation, Mitigation of negative effects.


